OCD VS. OCPD



OCD (Obsessive Compulsive Disorder)

OCD is a disorder defined as the presence of an obsession (an irrational thought or idea that continually repeats) or a compulsion (an irrational behavior performed repeatedly). These behaviors can occur together or on their own, and interfere with a person's quality of life and ability to function.

OCPD (Obsessive Compulsive Personality Disorder)

OCPD is a personality disorder defined by strict adherence to orderliness and control over one's environment at the expense of flexibility and the openness to new experiences. Examples of this can include: An excessive need for perfection and a relentless control over not only your environment but the nature of interpersonal relationships, The inability to get rid of items that no longer have value (hoarding).

OBSESSIVE-COMPULSIVE PERSONALITY DISORDER

DEFINITION

Obsessive-compulsive personality disorder (OCPD) is a personality disorder where the individual is extremely preoccupied with **perfection, order and control**. They feel that their perfectionism is necessary, good and correct, not realizing that it may interfere with their ability to complete tasks because their standards are so rigid. They may also withdraw emotionally when they are not able to control a situation, which can interfere with their ability to solve problems and form close relationships
