

Child Maltreatment	Signs / Indicators
Physical Abuse	Bruises, Welts, Bite Marks, Burns Abrasions
Physical Neglect	Unattended Medical Needs, Exhaustion, Lack of Supervision, Consistent Hunger, Poor Hygiene Emaciated Appearance
Sexual Abuse	Verbal cues from the child, Inappropriate Sexualized Behavior, Pain in Genital Area There are usually no physical symptoms as child sexual abuse is not a violent act, but rather an on-going with someone the child knows.
Emotional Abuse	Development Delays, Anti-social Behavior, Destructive Behavior, Extreme Passive or Aggressive Behavior
Common Findings in Parents of Abused Children	Does Not Volunteer Explanation for Child's Injury, Contradictory Explanations for Child's Injury, Evasive Answers to Questions, Anger Directed at Child for Being Injured, Little Concern for Child/Decreased Touching and/or Eye Contact, Inappropriate Response to Child Crying, Overprotective does not allow adult to question child alone
