The Federal Lost Wages Assistance program (LWA) is a federal program provided to states through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). Floridians who are currently receiving state or federal Reemployment Assistance benefits, are unemployed or partially unemployed due to COVID-19 and are currently receiving at least \$100 per week in Reemployment Assistance benefits will be eligible to receive the additional \$300 LWA benefits.

The Department is currently preparing to implement the LWA program to ensure eligible Floridians receive the additional benefits as quickly as possible.

The Internal Revenue Service continues to look for ways to help people who were unable to provide their information in time to receive Economic Impact Payments for their children. As part of that effort, the Internal Revenue Service announced today it will reopen the registration period for federal beneficiaries who didn't receive \$500 per child payments earlier this year.

The IRS urges certain federal benefit recipients to use the IRS.gov Non-Filers tool starting **August 15 through September 30** to enter information on their qualifying children to receive the supplemental \$500 payments.

Those eligible to provide this information include people with qualifying children who receive Social Security retirement, survivor or disability benefits, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Railroad Retirement benefits and Veterans Affairs Compensation and Pension (C&P) benefits and did not file a tax return in 2018 or 2019.

Any beneficiary who misses the September 30 deadline will need to wait until next year and claim it as a credit on their 2020 federal income tax return.

Course Overview: Trauma-Informed Resilient Schools teaches school professionals how to create trauma-informed schools and classrooms. The training focuses on resilience, exploring the core values and beliefs of educators and places an emphasis on understanding how trauma impacts children and their school experience. Lastly, proactive strategies such as fostering connections, prioritizing social and emotional skills, establishing safety, and promoting play are presented. This course provides detailed information and concrete actions that answer not just the "why" but also the "how" to create the best classroom and school supports for traumatized students and the school professionals who serve them.



September Is Suicide Prevention Month

Highlighting Suicide Prevention during COVID-19 and National Suicide Prevention Month

September is National Suicide Prevention Month, a time for us to think about ways we can help prevent suicide. In the United States, suicide is the tenth leading cause of death for all Americans. Suicide was responsible for more than 48,000 deaths in 2018, with a 35% increase in rates from 1999-2018. However, we know suicide is preventable and CDC's National Center for Injury Prevention and Control (NCIPC) has made suicide prevention a priority.

Focusing on suicide prevention is especially important now, during the COVID-19 pandemic, to remain connected to each other and to be aware of the signs of suicide risk and how to respond. During times of increased social distancing, people can still maintain social connections and care for their mental health.
