

Housing, Utilities, COVID Financial Updates



Statewide Medicaid Managed Care **Housing Assistance Program**

As of December 1, 2019, Simply became a part of the Statewide Medicaid Managed Care (SMMC) Housing Assistance program. Under this program, eligible members get benefits like:

- Help with transitioning into housing
- Support to help them stay in housing once they've found a place to
- Getting connected with services in the community
- Housing supports to help them take care of their health care needs.

This program also offers extra services like:

- Mobile crisis services to help deal with a crisis, if one happens
- Self-help peer support services from someone who has been through what you have

To qualify for this program, you must be a Simply Medicaid member, 21 years of age or older, meet certain requirements and live in one of these Florida counties:

- Brevard
- Osceola
- Seminole

- Orange
- **Pinellas**
- **Pasco**

Low-income internet for seniors, students, and families



- First, there are a variety of internet provider initiatives with discounted monthly rates that low-income families can usually access if their kids qualify for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP). Find out how to apply through an Internet Service Provider.
- The second option is a government assistance program called Lifeline, which offers \$9.25 per month off either internet or phone services to lowincome households. Contact your Internet Service Provider (ISP) to enroll in Lifeline through it. Find out if you meet the requirements before you decide which option to go with.

Spectrum Internet Assist

While Spectrum's low-income internet program is higher priced than the others on our list, it's also one of the few that offers aid to homes without K-12 children. It brings a lot more to the table too.

Spectrum Internet Assist is solid, offering broadband speeds of 30 Mbps and a free internet modem with additional Wi-Fi service for \$5 per month (internet providers normally charge \$10 per month for Wi-Fi routers). To top it off, you won't have to worry about data caps or contracts.

So if one or more of the people in your household are recipients of Supplemental Security Income, National School Lunch Program (NSLP), or Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) of the NSLP, you can fill out the Spectrum Internet Assist application.

New COVID-19 Financial Assistance Updates

Palm Bay Rental & Utility Payment Assistance **Applications Reopen For Qualified Residents**

Applications for rent, mortgage, and utility payment assistance reopen Monday, October 5, 2020. Qualified applicants will be served on a first-come/first-eligible, firstserved basis.

Eligible uses for the funding include rental or mortgage payment assistance, utility payment assistance, security deposits, and utility deposits. Utility payment assistance can only be provided if coupled with rent or mortgage payment assistance.

The City of Palm Bay received an additional allocation of Coronavirus Aid funding to assist qualified Palm Bay residents who have been financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic due to unemployment or under-employment.

Applications for assistance will reopen on Monday, October 5, 2020 and will remain open until all funding is expended. Applications must be complete. No incomplete applications will be considered. Qualified applicants will be served on a first-come/first-eligible, first-served basis. Applications for assistance are available online and will be made available through the City of Palm Bay Housing & Community Development Division office located at Palm Bay City Hall Annex, 120 Malabar Road SE, or by emailing: HCDinfo@pbfl.org.

DEADLINE IS OCTOBER 15

Low-income, no-income and/or homeless people are eligible to receive a stimulus check

Stimulus checks are just sitting there waiting for lowincome, no-income, unemployed and those who have become homeless. If you haven't yet received a stimulus check, you should register here now because the deadline is October 15.

If you don't typically file a federal income tax return, this message is for you. It doesn't matter if you're unemployed. It doesn't matter if you didn't earn any income at all. It doesn't matter if you are homeless, and it doesn't matter if you haven't filed taxes for years. What matters is that you may very well be eligible to receive a \$1,200 stimulus check, and it is important that you use the IRS Non-Filers tool by October 15 to claim your stimulus check.

There is absolutely no requirement in the law that you must actually earn an income or pay taxes in order to get a stimulus check. According to the IRS, U.S. citizens, permanent residents and qualifying resident aliens who meet the following guidelines are eligible for a stimulus check.



Florida Department of Economic Opportunity **Reemployment Assistance Update**

QUARTERLY UPDATES:

On a quarterly basis, pursuant to Federal guidance, DEO must determine whether or not individuals who are currently receiving Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) or Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC) are instead eligible for state Reemployment Assistance benefits.

Claimants who are currently receiving PUA or PEUC may need to take specific actions on their claim when they log-in to CONNECT and request benefit payments after October 1, 2020, when the new quarter comes into effect.

In the coming days, those claimants will receive an additional notification with specific instructions regarding their claim. Below is step-by-step instructions on what these claimants will need to do to ensure there is no break in receiving benefits.

Here's what to do... Take action to protect yourself thru the CDC moratorium on evictions. The moratorium is in effect thru Dec 31. You are required to complete a form for each adult in your home and provide it to your landlord. That form requires you to certify that you have tried to get assistance. If you have not filed for CARES Act Assistance you should do so now and keep a file of all the places you ask for help. Please keep paying as much as you can because this does not remove your obligation to pay

The CDC moratorium requires you to file a declaration with the landlord and you are certifying certain things - one for each adult. Here is the link to the form:
